The Danish Teaching Tradition

Danish higher education has a long tradition of combining academic excellence with a dynamic and innovative approach to education and research.

Danish higher education is well-known for its high international standards.

Educational institutions offer a dynamic study environment, emphasizing independent study, initiative and project-oriented learning. Studying in Denmark can be an excellent stepping stone for your future career, and will provide you with new skills and a unique experience.

Studies

As a student at a Danish higher education institution you are expected to play an active role in your learning process, and take responsibility for planning and carrying out your projects, either independently or together with other students. In addition to attending lectures you will be expected to participate in discussions and continuously develop your critical thinking and analytical skills.

For international students, the Danish approach to teaching and learning can introduce a whole new way of studying and thinking, which will challenge you and provide you with an excellent platform for your future career.

Practice placements

During the practice placement you will gain valuable hands-on experience within your field of study which will prepare you for entering the “real life” after finishing your studies.

Although you will be assigned to a supervisor, it is important that you are independent and take responsibility for your own learning, as this is an important part of the Danish way of learning and it helps you to gain the most of your practice placement.

The Danish Grading System

The 7-point grading scale used in Denmark is compatible with the ECTS grading scale. Pass/fail assessments may also be used.

12	For an excellent performance displaying a high level of command of all aspects of the relevant material, with no or only a few minor weaknesses.	A
10	For a very good performance displaying a high level of command of most aspects of the relevant material, with only minor weaknesses.	B
7	For a good performance displaying good command of the relevant material but also some weaknesses.	C
4	For a fair performance displaying some command of the relevant material but also some major weaknesses.	D
02	For a performance meeting only the minimum requirements for acceptance. (This is the minimum grade for passing an exam).	E
00	For a performance which does not meet the minimum requirements for acceptance.	F

Housing Guide

The purpose of this guide is to provide you with all the necessary information about your housing arrangement.

Accommodation

If you are enrolled at one of our campuses in Vejle or Jelling, the International Office will try to find you a room through private landlords. For example you could be offered a room belonging to a Danish student, who would like to sub rent her own room/accommodation to you during a study abroad period.

Another option is accommodation through Lillebaelt Hospital, who provides accommodation to short term medical staff. If they have rooms available, you will be offered one of their rooms. These rooms are furnished and provided with bed linen, towels, dishtowels etc. There are kitchen utensils in all rooms.

Accommodation through AirBnb

In case the International Office can't find a room through our network of private landlords, we will let you know well before you travel to Denmark.

The Triangle Region

The towns Billund, Fredericia, Kolding, Middelfart, Vejen and Vejle make up the Triangle Region. There are lots of activities and sights in the area, and among the most popular you will find:



- Legoland - only half an hour from Jelling, the amusement park constructed from Lego bricks is a major attraction in Denmark. www.legoland.dk



- Givskud Zoo - has more than 900 animals that you can watch from a “Safari Bus.” www.givskudzoo.dk



- The Jelling Monuments - a UNESCO World Heritage Site right in Jelling! The Viking Age rune stones near the church mark the Danish transition to Christianity in the 900s. www.kongernesjelling.dk



- Vejle Ådal - a beautiful valley area ideal for hiking or bicycling. www.vejleaaadal.dk



- Jelling Music Festival - Jelling's largest party in the last weekend of May usually attracts most students! www.jellingmusikfestival.dk

If you plan to visit many of the tourist sites in the Triangle Region, you might benefit from getting an Activity Pass from the Vejle Tourist Office.

The Activity Pass, which is free of charge, is valid for 14 days from the day of issue, and will grant you up to 20 % discount on entrance fees at 51 attractions in the Triangle Region.

Social Activities

General Practical Information

Insurance

University College Lillebaelt does **not** cover any medical costs for exchange students (including accidents in connection with studies). All students are responsible for their own health, accident and travel insurances. Do not forget to take insurance that covers all of these during both your stay in Denmark and your travel to and from Denmark. For eventual leisure time excursions, it is advisable to make sure that the insurance is valid in Denmark's neighboring countries as well.

Students from EU countries must also bring their European Health Card with them. For further information on the card, please contact the social insurance office in your home country. Note that the European Health Insurance Card is not valid during your travels to and from Denmark or during any excursions to a third country.

Remember to bring a valid copy of your insurance policy with you. The citizens of EU countries are entitled to all health services in Denmark, if they are covered by health insurance in their home country and they have the European Health Card. Even so, all exchange students need separate insurance that covers the whole exchange period.

How to get in touch with a doctor

Phone your doctor in his or her office hours, typically in the morning, to make an appointment. The name, telephone number and address of your doctor are written on your health insurance card. You can also look it up in the telephone directory under *Læger*. You must always remember to bring your yellow health insurance card with you. It is also a good idea to bring an accurate and complete physical and mental health information document to secure a safe and healthy study abroad experience.

Doctor on duty

If you need to consult a doctor outside regular working hours on weekdays (i.e. between 16:00 and 08:00), on weekends or public holidays, you must call the Doctor on Duty (Lægevagten). Phone +45 7011 0707. It should **only** be used in case of an acute illness. You have to call in advance to talk to a doctor before going to see him/her.

Emergency

In cases of a serious emergency, dial 112 (free call from pay phones). Ask for an ambulance, the police or the fire department (whatever is relevant), state your name, address and the telephone number you are calling from. Stay by the telephone until your information has been confirmed.

In case of acute illness outside the doctor's opening hours (08:00-16:00), please use the "Lægevagten" phone: +45 7011 0707.

How to get in touch with a dentist

If you need dental treatment you are free to choose your dentist. Look in the telephone directory under *Tandlæger*, or ask a friend to recommend one. Please note that you will usually have to make an appointment in advance, and that dental treatment is fairly expensive in Denmark.

Transportation

Public Transport

DSB Orange (Discounted Train Tickets)

Sometimes you can get discounts if you buy an Orange Train Ticket. A DSB orange ticket is a discounted ticket that is sold in limited amounts. If there are still orange tickets available for your selected train(s) that will be a cheaper solution compared to standard tickets. Tickets can be purchased at all DSB and Arriva stations and over the phone (70 13 14 15). If you book 1-2 months in advance, you can save a lot of money.

Bus Tickets (Periodekort/monthly card/rejsekort)

As an international student who would like to use the busses on an everyday basis, we recommend you to buy a "Periodekort", a monthly card or a general traveling card: Rejsekort: https://www.rejsekort.dk/?sc_lang=en . We strongly recommend you to buy the anonymous version.

You can buy this card in either Vejle or Kolding, the sales shops are listed here: <https://www.sydtrafik.dk/billetter-og-priser/billeteralg> With this card you can travel in Vejle or in Kolding, and the rest of Denmark, as many times as you want and you automatically get discounts with the Rejsekort.

Other bus tickets available for you:

Ticket prices are based on the number of zones you travel through.

You can buy a single ticket on the bus, please note that you can only use Danish Kroner.

Please be aware that you might be fined if you do not buy a ticket or a relevant ticket.

You enter the bus at the front – you either buy your ticket from the driver or show him/her your existing ticket/card.

Taxi

If you want to pay with your credit card, please inform the driver at the beginning. Otherwise it is expected that you pay by cash. Phone number taxi: +45 70 20 12 22.

Arrival/Departure

On arrival

- If you are an EU/EEA citizen staying for more than 3 months and you have not applied for a residence permit from your home country, please contact Statsforvaltningen Syddanmark to do so immediately.

- When you have received your residence permit, you must go to the National Register (Folkeregistret) to be registered and receive the Danish central registration number (cpr. nr.), provided your stay exceeds three months (special rules for Nordic citizens apply). Remember to bring your passport and residence permit. Some of our departments arrange to take students to the National Register. Please ask the international coordinator.

Before your departure from Denmark

If you have stayed 3 months or more:

- Notify the National Register (Folkeregistret) that you will be departing the country.
- Hand in your Danish Health Insurance Card at the National Register (Folkeregistret).
- EU citizens must send their residence permit to Statsforvaltningen Syddanmark with information on their planned day of departure.
- Please make arrangements with the international coordinator about returning any keys, bicycle, linen, kitchen utensils, mobile modem etc.
